Christmas is a Season

With the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord this Sunday, the Christmas Season comes to an end in the Ordinary Form calendar. Hopefully, all of you were able to make a true season of it, since Christmas is not just a day but a season.

Our culture emphasizes anticipation more than the full realization of what is celebrated. How often have we seen neighbors or stores taking down Christmas decorations, or Holiday decorations since there was nothing religious about them, the day after or within a few days after Christmas? This kind of shallowness does not lend itself to people integrating important events more deeply into their lives. National holidays have lost aspects that were meant to foster religious and civic virtues. The word season is so appropriate because seasons are often centered on planting, growth and harvest. It takes a season of growth and maturation to see the benefits of planting seeds. With Christmas drawing to a close, I pray that the joy and gratitude of this season bore rich and lasting fruit in our lives and homes.

EPIPHANY PROCLAMATION 2016

While a day like Christmas is fixed in our minds and on the calendars on December 25th, many of the important feasts of the Church year move, based upon the date that Easter is set. Easter changes each year moving to the Sunday after the "Paschal Full Moon," and can fall between March 22 and April 25.

In ancient times before calendars were common, most people did not know the dates for the upcoming Liturgical year. On Epiphany Sunday, the upcoming dates were "proclaimed". After the singing of the Gospel, a Deacon or cantor, in keeping with an ancient practice of Holy Church, announces from the ambo the moveable feasts of the current year according to this formula:

Know, dear brethren, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior.

On the Tenth day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.

On the Twenty-Seventh day of March you will celebrate with Joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the Fifth day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ. [Transferred to the following Sunday in our Archdiocese.]

In the Fifteenth day of May the feast of Pentecost.

On the Twenty-Ninth day of May, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the Twenty-Seventh day of November the First Sunday of Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever.

Mass: Johann Nepomuk Hummel, Mass in B-flat Offertory: W. A. Mozart, Church Sonata in B-flat, K 68 (1775) In his day, Johann Nepomuk Hummel (1778-1837) was highly respected as a composer and pianist. As a star pupil of Wolfgang Mozart, he was recommended in 1804 for the post of concert master for the court of Prince Nikolaus II Esterhazy. While there Hummel served under music director Joseph Haydn and assumed that position upon Haydn's death in May of 1809. Although he is most remembered for his piano compositions, his sacred music is also well regarded. The wonderful melodies presented in Hummel's Mass in B-flat are typical of the early romantics.
