Feast of Saint Agnes

Today we celebrate the Feast of Saint Agnes! Every parish has the option to transfer the patronal feast to the nearest Sunday. The Feast of Saint Agnes is traditionally celebrated on January 21st. Let us thank God for the wonderful model of faithfulness and purity we have been given by Saint Agnes and ask for her continued intercession.

Septuagesima – 70 Days

Traditionally, this Sunday marks the beginning of the proximate preparation for Lent. The Latin name, Septuagesima, refers to the fact that it is three Sundays away from the start of Lent, called Quadragesima Sunday, more than literally the number seventy. The two intervening Sundays are called Sexagesima (60) and Quinquagesima (50) in the Latin Church.

According to the liturgical expert, Abbot Gueranger, the early Roman Church had no reason to anticipate the fasting and privation of Lent except by beginning the fast on the Wednesday before the first Sunday of Lent in order to have 40 days of fasting and penance. However, the Greeks, because they did not traditionally fast on Saturdays and Sundays, had some additional days to make up in order to account for the number forty. Thus, the Greeks added twelve ferial days and started Lent at what we would call Sexagesima. It also appears that monks and a few other eastern churches began Lent even earlier, at what is now called Septuagesima Sunday. Therefore, to honor these other traditions and also to not cause scandal, the Roman Church adopted the Septuagesima season as a kind of preparation for Lent.

For our purposes, a time of preparation before Lent is very fitting so that we can prayerfully begin to consider what might be good penances for us to undertake during Lent. Last minute ideas may not be prudent since they may be too difficult or too easy or even not spiritually meaningful for us.

Bulletin Changes Coming Soon

On the weekend of February 6th and 7th you will notice a slight change in the bulletin. The half page flap will no longer be included. The change in format will allow a few extra services from our publisher for the parish without additional cost. First, we will be able to publish and distribute bulletins for Ash Wednesday and Christmas - we have not been able to do so in the past. Second, we have the option to print three special newsletters that can be distributed at church or mailed to parishioners. Third, we will also have the ability to produce full color bulletins or newsletters. It is also beneficial for me since the amount of space for which I need to write will only be one column, as opposed to a full page. In all humility and truthfulness, I am not as gifted as my immediate predecessors in the area of the written word.

Blessing of Candles on February 2nd

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord has traditionally been called Candlemas Day, for on this day candles are blessed for church use and for use by the faithful in their homes. We will bless candles twice that day: at the 8:00 am Mass in the Chapel and after 7:30 pm Novena which is also in the chapel. You are cordially invited to bring candles to be blessed at Mass or after the evening devotions. A limited number of candles will be provided by the parish for those unable to bring their own.

Saint Blaise Blessing of Throats, February 3rd

In honor of the popular Feast of Saint Blaise and the great interest in the blessing of throats, I am happy to offer **two Masses** on **Wednesday**, **February 3**rd, during which the traditional blessing of throats will be administered. We will have our usual Wednesday, 8:00 am Mass and add a 5:15 pm Mass that evening as well.

The music for this Mass is sponsored by Virginia Schubert in memory of Msgr. Richard J. Schuler, and in honor of past and present members of the Twin Cities Catholic Chorale

Composer Charles François Gounod (1818-1893) was a practicing Catholic and as a youth intended to become a priest. This *Messe Solennelle* was dedicated by the composer to Saint Cecilia, the patron saint of musicians, who like Saint Agnes was martyred for her faith in Rome and is memorialized in both the Roman Canon and the Roman Martyrology. The *Gloria* and *Credo* are famous for their drama, power and memorable melodies. The *Sanctus* with the enormous and beautiful tenor solo reaches a full musical climax at "*Hosanna in excelsis*" near the end of the movement. The Twin Cities Catholic Chorale is a non-profit corporation, which depends solely on the generosity of its patrons. Programs are posted on the Chorale web site at www.catholicchorale.org.
