# PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Masses a couple months ago, I wanted to explain, in writing, the recent change in practice regarding special collections or appeals.

Special appeals, such as the red envelope in support of our school and the green envelopes for heat, light and water, will be taken up by the ushers at one time during the normal collection. For example, on First Sundays, there will be one collection (i.e. the ushers will only go through the aisles once) but parishioners can still contribute to one or both apostolates, parish and/or the school. The same is true for Sundays when other envelopes are hoped to be received such as this weekend when we are asking for help with our utility bills. In short, on some weekends people will put in two envelopes for two different purposes in one collection.

Why this change? First and foremost, this will allow more uninterrupted time for prayer after Holy Communion. This is no small thing. The main purpose for assistance at Mass every Sunday is to praise and thank the Lord. Second, having the ushers take up one collection will help the faithful to prayerfully plan what they are giving and to what apostolate or need. Loose cash in the plate, although welcome, is not the ideal way for any of us to be good stewards. All too often we can be caught unawares that a special appeal is happening and we end up giving from what might be in our wallets at that time. (Some wish to give anonymously by putting cash into the plates and that is their choice.) I admit that in the short term, there may be a drop in money dedicated to the school or to the utilities due to a drop in loose cash donations. Hopefully, in the long term, this motivates parishioners to be more discerning and purposeful in their support of the parish, school, and physical plant.

There is one exception. When we have our annual missionary appeal, there will be a true second collection taken up by the ushers. This is due to the fact that often the missionaries do not provide special envelopes or more time is needed to prepare those gifts.

#### \*Catholic Services Appeal

The Catholic Services Appeal funds \$800,000 annually in need based scholarship to Catholic High Schools, including Saint Agnes School. In 2015, Saint Agnes received \$78,750 from the Appeal for high school scholarships, in addition to \$56,000 in grade school assistance. That is a total of \$134,750 in financial assistance!

The 2016 Catholic Services Appeal has begun. Please watch for the 2016 ask and do all you can to support the CSAF. Thank you!
