## PASTOR'S COLUMN

#### Parish Celebration of 40 Hours - March 6

I am pleased to announce that a son of Saint Agnes parish and 2005 Aggie alumnus, transitional **Deacon Mark Pavlak**, will preach for our annual closing of Forty Hours, at 4pm Vespers Sunday, March 6<sup>th</sup>. This longstanding tradition of our parish is a beautiful and fitting way to celebrate Laetare Sunday and, most importantly, to worship Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. #### Pierce Butler – Not Simply a Short-cut to & from St. Agnes

It was several months into my assignment here at Saint Agnes before I learned about the mini-freeway that is Pierce Butler Route. Yes, it shaves several minutes off of my travel time to visit my parents up north. Embarrassingly, it has taken over three years longer to discover the man behind the name. He is worth learning about.

An editorial writer from the Washington Post, Charles Lane, recently enlightened me as to who he was and a significant action of his that is worth learning about in today's political and cultural environment. (The point of Lane's editorial was to recommend a book by Adam Cohen chronicling dark moments in the history of the Supreme Court.) Pierce Butler was the first Supreme Court justice to come from Minnesota and he was Catholic. In a 1927 case, Buck v. Bell, He was the sole dissenter. He dissented without writing an opinion. What is specifically noteworthy is not the lack of reasoning behind his lone stand, but the utter lack of reasoning behind the majority opinion. At the height of the eugenics craze, the Supreme Court upheld a Virginia law that allowed for the forced sterilization of "feeble minded" or "unfit" citizens. Even the famous Justice, Oliver Wendell Holmes Jr., said of the woman who was to be sterilized, "Three generations of imbeciles are enough." Holmes also opined that the lone dissenter did so because he was influenced by his Catholic faith saying, "Butler knows this is good law, I wonder whether he will have the courage to vote with us in spite of his religion." We may never know why Butler dissented, but he most definitely had courage. It is not a stretch of the imagination to presume that Butler's dissent had everything to do with the dignity of the human person as considered from both faith and reason.

Pierce Butler died at the age of 73 while still serving on the high court. He is buried at the nearby Calvary Cemetery in St. Paul. May more have his courage to stand against a misguided majority in defense of true human dignity.

P.S. Buck v. Bell was never officially over-turned but starting in 1942, with such cases as Skinner v. Oklahoma, forced sterilization began to lose its legal footing. Amazingly, during the Nuremberg war crimes trials, Nazi doctors quoted the Oliver Wendell Holmes opinion in their own defense! By the 1960's sterilization laws were not being enforced although still on the books.
