

THE ARCHDIOCESE OF SAINT PAUL & MINNEAPOLIS WELCOMES ARCHBISHOP-DESIGNATE BERNARD A. HEBDA



On Holy Thursday, March 24, Pope Francis formally named Archbishop Bernard A. Hebda as the new leader of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis.

Archbishop-Designate Hebda has been serving as Apostolic Administrator of the Archdiocese since June 15, 2015. During that time, he has also been serving the Archdiocese of Newark, New Jersey, as Coadjutor Archbishop, and was scheduled to replace Archbishop John J. Myers when he is expected to retire in July.

The son of Bernard and the late Helen Clark Hebda, the Archbishop-Designate Hebda was born on September 3, 1959 in Pittsburgh, PA. He was ordained to the priesthood on July 1, 1989 in St. Paul Cathedral in Pittsburgh. His Episcopal ordination took place on December 1, 2009.

In addition to serving the Archdioceses of Newark and Saint Paul and Minneapolis, he was Bishop of the Diocese of Gaylord, Michigan and has served at the Vatican and in parishes in his hometown of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Upon being told of his appointment, Archbishop Hebda said he was "humbled by this expression of Pope Francis's confidence and honored to serve this Archdiocese with its rich history and its long tradition of extraordinary priests, zealous Religious and empowered laity, all working to put their faith into action."

Archbishop-Designate Hebda's Installation Mass is scheduled for 2 p.m., Friday, May 13, the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima, at the Cathedral of Saint Paul.

Mass: Joseph Haydn, *Harmoniemesse* (1802) Processional: César Franck, Psalm 150 (1884) Offertory: Pietro Yon, Motet: *Victimae Paschali Laudes* (1919)

Composed in 1802, while Joseph Haydn (1732-1809) was employed by Prince Nicolaus II Esterházy, the Harmoniemesse is the last of Haydn's six great Masses. It follows the completion of his over 100 symphonies and belongs to the period of the composition of his oratorios. The nickname comes from the use of many wind instruments. The prominence of the brass and winds enhances the festive nature of the work, especially the opening of the Gloria, the Pleni of the Sanctus, and the Dona nobis pacem in the Agnus Dei. The Et incarnatus est in the Credo is set for soprano solo, trumpets, horns, and timpani - truly a passage of great and tender beauty. The Twin Cities Catholic Chorale is a nonprofit corporation, which depends solely on the generosity of its patrons. Programs are posted on the Chorale web site at www.catholicchorale.org. Next Sunday the Chorale & Orchestra will present Joseph Haydn's Heiligmesse.
