#### PASTOR'S COLUMN

#### A Window into the Life of the Early Church

Every Easter Season the Church gives us, for our edification, readings at Mass from the Acts of the Apostles. This is true both for Sundays and weekdays. I have also had the good fortune to be able to teach a tenth grade class on the New Testament. As a beautiful coincidence, we have been reading in class about Acts during the Easter Season. This opportunity for me to re-read, in its entirety, the Acts of the Apostles and prepare lecture notes has been particularly enjoyable for me. I have always liked history because it helps to expand our horizons by considering how others have lived, especially how they have risen to meet the challenges of their day. The first several decades of the church are all the more fascinating because we have been given such an exciting account of how the first generation of believers responded to the grace and enlightenment of God.

I would like to share with you some of the important messages from the Acts of the Apostles.

- 1. Moral lessons about universal truths: Although the incident concerning Ananias and Sapphira has not found its way into the readings at Mass, it is an unnerving lesson in the need to be authentic and honest. This couple sold some land with the intention of making it appear that they were giving all the proceeds to the Apostles for works of charity but they secretly held some money back. They literally dropped dead in the sight of the Apostles as a warning to others to be honest.
- 2. The role of the Holy Spirit: The Holy Spirit was not only active at Pentecost. In chapter four, the apostles and believers gather to pray for boldness in their teaching, "And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken; and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God with boldness." There are multiple examples of decisions made under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.
- 3. The growth of the church despite opposition/persecution: No matter what the enemies of the Church did to persecute, the numbers of believers kept increasing.
- 4. The basic plot movement of Acts from Jerusalem to Rome: this signifies the spread of the Gospel from the Holy Land to the rest of the world and from the Jewish world to include the Gentile world.
- 5. What the Church looked like and how it worked: The orders of Bishops, Presbyter (elders) and Deacons are all mentioned. The hierarchical order of the Church and the magisterium under the leadership of Peter is clear throughout but especially in the Council of Jerusalem (Acts 15.) Furthermore, the very center of the life of both laity and clergy is clearly identified in chapter two: "And they held steadfastly to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of the bread [Mass] and the prayers [liturgy of the hours]."

These same characteristics of the early church should be alive and well today! Let us not squelch the Spirit, but live our new lives in Christ as energetically as possible.

#### CHORALE & ORCHESTRA NOTES

Mass: Franz Schubert, Mass in G (1815)

Offertory: W.A. Mozart, Church Sonata in G, K 274 (1777)

With this Mass, the second composed by Franz Schubert (1797-1828), we experience his gift for lyric beauty and simplicity. Although he was only 18 years old, he had already composed over 150 musical pieces. By the time of his death at age 31, Schubert had composed almost 1,000 works, including six complete Masses and more than 600 songs. Historical documents indicate that young Franz composed his Mass in G in just five days, in March of 1815. This popular Mass, though simple, is a real pearl. There is a measured simplicity in the Credo, rising from a humble beginning to an imposing climax at the Et resurrexit. The Twin Cities Catholic Chorale is a non-profit corporation, which depends solely on the generosity of its patrons. Programs are posted on the Chorale website at www.catholicchorale.org. Next Sunday, the Ascension of the Lord, the Chorale & Orchestra will present its premier of W.A. Mozart's Spatzenmesse K 220, in memory of Mother Mary Angelica of the Annunciation.
