PASTOR'S COLUMN

Abiding in the Word of God

"[The Word of God] is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out." Moses' words from the first reading this Sunday in the ordinary form prefigure the revelation of Christ and the Holy Mass, where the Word and Sacrament take residence in our minds and hearts.

As I begin what I hope is a long residence at Saint Agnes Church and School, I cannot fathom the Lord's goodness in placing me here. As an Archdiocesan priest, originally from Lake Crystal, MN, I have served at St. John Neumann in Eagan, and St. John the Baptist in New Brighton. My parents still live in that area, as does my brother. My sister and her family lives in West St. Paul.

I moved to St. Paul in August 2000 to become a Jesuit novice. Though some aspects of the life were edifying, frequently the worship was not. It was then that I sought a Sunday Mass where reverence for the Word of God was strong, and its beauty was manifest in ritual and sacred music. I recall feeling lifted out of my pew for the first time by the beauty and splendor of Mass here.

In the fall of 2001, I received permission to teach religion at Saint Agnes School for my novice apostolate. I was teaching such a class on Sept. 11, 2001 in the school library. When we heard of the tragedy on the PA system, we prayed the rosary for the remainder of the class, turning to Our Lady, who is our hope "in this valley of tears."

I learned in those years that Holy Mother Church is the island of sanity in a chaotic world. Some parishes and schools participate in the security and peace that only the Word of God provides. I have found no parish or school that more fully participates in these gifts of God, since this holy ground has been so sanctified daily by the prayers of generations of faithful Catholics and continues to be.

I have been appointed as a teacher in the eleventh grade of our school, as well as a spiritual director of ten men at St. John Vianney's seminary. And though this work will consume most of my time, I am humbled and eager to serve the Word of God and you at our parish. Please pray for me that I might receive and pass on the Word of God faithfully and well.

July 16 & 17: Missionary Appeal Weekend

Next weekend, July 16 and 17, the Church of Saint Agnes will be hosting a Missionary Appeal to assist St. John Mary Vianney Seminary in the Diocese of San Carlos, Philippines. Our guest will be Fr. Martin Brodit.

The Diocese of San Carlos has only 75 priests ministering to over 1 million Catholics. This urgent need spurred the creation of a College seminary in the heart of the Diocese of San Carlos where future priests are trained to become workers in God's vineyard. As the Seminary continued its vigorous campaigns for vocations, a significant increase in the number of Seminarians has been noted. From less than 10 in 1993, the Seminary Community has grown significantly and has outgrown its humble buildings in the Bishop's Home Compound. A new building with new classroom facilities has been proposed and begun. The land was gifted to the Diocese, but funds were available for only 60% of the buildings themselves.

The purpose of this mission is introduce this need and collect donations that will be channeled to the completion of construction and purchasing of the fixtures needed for the College, especially for the Chapel. A generous response to the Mission Appeal will truly complete and realize this sacred endeavor. This collective dream and vision will definitely be a positive contribution towards the mission of building God's Kingdom here on earth.


