PASTOR'S COLUMN

Insurance Policy Funds Church Repair and Repainting

By the time of you read this, the large sections of scaffolding inside our church will have been disassembled. Slowly, over the course of the last three months, the scaffolding has been moved from one section of the church to another so as to allow access to the water damaged ceiling above. With the complete deterioration of the tar paper underneath the clay tile of our church's old roof, and the fact that many of the clay tiles themselves were broken or missing, water was able to seep into our church. Adding to these problems, the copper flashing and gutters were also failing, resulting in more water damage inside and out. None of the heat tape, meant to melt ice dams, was functioning. The most noticeable victim of the failed roof was the painted ceiling dating from the 1987 redecoration. Anyone who raised their eyes inside our church could easily see the staining and flecking of the baroque paint scheme. Especially affected were the areas immediately below the roof valleys of the transepts. Note the damage to the vaulting of the east transept pictured to the left.

Thanks to the sacrificial gifts of so many parishioners and friends of Saint Agnes during our recent capital campaign, *Honoring Our Past, Preserving Our Future,* we were able to greatly improve our roof system, not just repair it. Please accept my deepest gratitude for supplying the means to keep the dangerous elements outside our beautiful church. With the outside envelope improved, including the front steps and terrace, we were then able to focus our attention on the interior of church such as the newly remodeled bathrooms and, most recently, the richly decorated baroque ceiling.

I am happy to report that, in return for decades of paying insurance premiums, the plaster repair and repainting was covered by our insurance company, Catholic Mutual. The only direct cost to the parish was several thousand dollars in deductibles. My thanks also goes to our Business Administrator, Patrick Menke, who carefully ensured that our years of investing in insurance was able to benefit us in this time of need.

Thank you for the sacrifices you have all made in putting up with disturbed sight lines, being displaced from your traditional pew and the dust resulting from the plaster repair and scaffolding reassembly.

In the coming weeks only one or two small 10x10 foot towers will be needed to complete the work on the ceiling. Afterwards, lower sections of ceiling in the vestibule, Maria Hilf chapel and sacristy will be repainted. Thank you again for your patience and understanding as we continue to be good stewards of the beautiful Church of Saint Agnes our ancestors passed onto us.
