DEACON JOSEPH DAMIANI



I am very grateful to have the opportunity to be here at Saint Agnes. I look forward to working with Fr. Moriarty and you in serving our parish.

Although my previous assignments were in Minneapolis, my roots are in Saint Paul. My grandfather and his brother came here from Celano, Italy in 1906 and opened a Italian grocery store on the corner of East 7th Street and Payne Avenue.

In 1955 we moved from the East Side to a 160-acre farm near Rosemount where I attended St. Joseph's Catholic School. The sisters of Saint Agnes from Fond du Lac Wisconsin taught at the school. They passed on to me their devotion to Saint Agnes. It was there that I also learned to love the liturgy and served at Mass from 1961-1965.

After attending high school in Rosemount, I graduated from the University of Saint Thomas in 1974 with a degree in Business Administration. My first job after college was with the Control Data Corporation in Bloomington. Subsequently I became an IT consultant for various firms in the Twin Cities.

In 2009 I was ordained as a permanent deacon for the Archdiocese. My first parish assignment was at Annunciation in Minneapolis. In addition to the liturgy I assisted in sacramental preparation and catechesis.

In 2010 I was appointed as interim director and administrator for the Office of Indian Ministry, where I developed an appreciation of the spirituality of our Native people and their devotion to the Catholic Church.

Sandie and I were married in 1975 and we have two children and six grandchildren. My son Matthew was admitted to candidacy to the Permanent Diaconate for the Archdiocese of Saint Paul Minneapolis last Thursday. Some of my outside interests are aviation, astronomy, and ancient coin collecting.

Ludwig van Beethoven, Mass in C, Op 86 (1807)

The *Mass in C* by Ludwig van Beethoven (1770-1827) was composed in 1807 for the name day, September 12, the Most Holy Name of Mary, of Princess Maria Hermengild Esterházy. At this time Beethoven was beginning to suffer hearing loss that would lead to his total deafness in the following decade. The Twin Cities Catholic Chorale is a nonprofit corporation, which depends solely on the generosity of its patrons. Programs are available at the church entrances and posted on the Chorale's website at www.catholicchorale.org. This Wednesday, November 2, (All Souls Day), the Chorale & Orchestra will present W.A.
